TROPICANA'S 20TH ANNIVERSARY CHIP

Two days after Trump Marina issued the final three chips in their restaurant series, Tropicana issued their 20th Anniversary chip without any advance notification on Friday, November 16th. Most of the usual "in-the-know" chippers were caught completely offguard with this surprise chip release, not finding out about it until the very morning on the day the chip was to be issued at noon. Plans and schedules had to be modified, changed, or aborted in order to get to Atlantic City before this 1000 chip issue was completely sold-out.

Brenda, Buddy and I were in Atlantic City by 5:00 p.m. and we were limited to a rigidly enforced ten chips per person purchase. We got our first stack of 20 chips and returned after 8 p.m. when the shift changed to pick up

20 more chips between the two of us. After watching the 11 o'clock news, it was back to Trop where we were able to catch the pit boss and table dealer out to dinner and secured another stack of 20, plus we were able to convince a couple of players to purchase ten chips each for us. In addition, our next-door neighbor and his wife had visited Tropicana during the afternoon and each got ten chips. After tipping off a couple of chip collecting friends of ours from Smithville about the release, they were able to double-dip twice. Once more they came through for me as they did with the Trump Marina releases.. Finally, just after the 4:00 a.m. Saturday morning shift change, I visited Trop again and the same two roulette players I met at midnight were still playing and with their help, I was able to secure an adequate supply of chips for my customers. I even bumped into Bruce Connick, a chip collector who was playing roulette at 4:00 a.m. and he didn't even know that a new chip had been released at that very table.

During the A.C. Chapter Meeting the following day on Sunday, I was told there were still chips available on the roulette table at Tropicana. I only mention this story, because there are other stories that abound about how easy it is to get LE's from Tropicana. Those stories are also accurate, because many chippers only need ten chips or less for themselves and their friends. The end result is that everybody got what they wanted ... and that's good,; except that some of us had to make a little bit more of a special effort than others.

2001 Edition of Black's A.C. Catalog still available!

At this point in time I don't see myself coming out with a 2002 Edition of my Atlantic City Catalog. Sales of the 2001 version have not been up to par, so I've decided to skip a year. Fact is, I was originally going to skip issuing a 2001 Edition, but was convinced by several chippers to go ahead with it.

As most of you know, these annual catalogs are not mass-produced, but are completely assembled, front and back covers laminated, and spirally bound by myself after giving the actual printing of the pages job to a local Quickie Print outlet here in Wall, NJ. Only 250

copies were produced this year and almost half of them currently remain unsold. I believe the drop in catalog sales has to do with the fact that I have published most of the information appearing in the catalogs on my popularly visited website at www.callzia.com/dghome/acchips/hom e.htm

In this 8 ¹/₂" x 11" format, spiral bound, heavy-duty laminated covers, 140 pages ...22 of which are in full-color on glossy page stock, are illustrations of every known Atlantic City chip and token issuedup to the \$100 denomination. All of the current \$500 and several \$1000 current denomination chips are also illustrated for the first time.

A comprehensive section on Silver Strikes is also included as are all the Fun Nite paper and Fun Nite chips; Tournament chips; shoe chips; and several illegal A.C. chips in play prior to legalized gambling are illustrated, as well as new chip discoveries since the previous catalog issue was published.

A new "History of Atlantic City" article by Steve Piccolo has been introduced in this latest issue of "Black's Catalog". An updated price

guide for this 2001 Edition is also included in the \$32.50 price.

Here is a tough holographic chip that very few Atlantic City chip collectors have in their collections. It has been listed in previous issues of my catalog as CC CAE-5tt (Righteous Brothers) and has an estimated value of \$100 in my price guide.

At the time that estimate was published, there were only two of these hologram chips known that had been brought to my attention. One chip was purchased at one of Tom Plau's Ocean City chip shows a few years ago. Another specimen was offered for sale in Bob Mera's huge auction where it brought \$100. I now have four of these chips in my possession that were discovered at a flea market and are now available for sale to the highest bidder. Since these four additional specimens have been discovered, I don't think this chip will bring a \$100 bid, but it will be interesting to see how much it does go for among this very small group of specialized competitive A.C. collectors. Be advised that all four available specimens are notched... as were the previously mentioned two specimens.

A unique feature of this chip is that it is recessed where the hologram area is inserted. Those of you who are familiar with the CHIPCO product will know that CHIPCO's have a smooth surface across the face from edge to edge. I will post the four successful bids, and bidders, in the January e-News.
